First, in the file containing the data of interest, left-mouse click on the gray integer outside the table which precedes the line of interest. This causes the complete line to be marked by a red rectangle:

and chose Edit -> Copy (or, Ctrl + C).


Now simply chose Edit -> Paste Special -> Paste with Header Row. This will both initiate a new .dwar file and populate the file with the selected row:











To copy multiple adjacent lines from one .dwar file into the next, keep the shift-key pressed during the selection with the left-mouse button click. To copy multiple lines which are not adjacent to each other into a new .dwar file, use the Ctrl key instead.


